

Detailed information for authors

The *Rethinking Economics Australia Student Journal* seeks to contribute towards pluralist and open-minded thinking in economics by providing an opportunity for students across Australia to share and get feedback on the ideas they have developed in their studies. Submitting to, editing, and reading the journal, opens up an opportunity for students to collaborate with other students, as well as academic, and industry partners, across the Rethinking Economics network. This collaboration welcomes submissions that take pluralist and open-minded approaches to the study of economics and its role in addressing problems pertinent to the real world.

Submission policy

Abstracts

Abstracts must fall within the 150-word limit (excluding references), and use in-text references according to the Harvard System of short references. It is the abstract that will receive feedback from the advisory team of academics and postgraduate students. For that reason we suggest a special focus on clarity in your writing to make the most of the opportunity for feedback.

Manuscripts

Manuscripts of 3000-words, or less than 10-pages (excluding references). They should be 1.5 spaced (including footnotes and references), with tables and figures attached on separate pages at the end of your manuscript. References must be included in the same style as the abstract. Upon submission of your manuscript it will be reviewed by the editorial team and if any corrections are necessary we will contact you to make them.

Verification and replicability

If your submission involves empirical analysis, please also submit datasets, code and information on programs you have used so that your work can be replicated by readers. However, you should not submit data or files if publication of them would breach the rights of a third party or if any individuals are identifiable from the data.

Code should be readable and commented throughout to guide readers through the computations being performed.

Pre-publication policy

The *Rethinking Economics Australia Student Journal* will not accept submissions that have been published elsewhere.

As our authors are students, you should also check that you are following your own university rules for the use of work previously completed for a unit of study, or the use of previous research undertaken in a formal relationship with your university (for example, your honours thesis). If you are unsure about such matters, contact the editorial team and the academic you completed the work for or with.
